## MINUTES Council on Postsecondary Education Executive Committee June 10, 2011

The Executive Committee of the Council on Postsecondary Education met June 10, 2011, at 8 a.m. (ET) at Transylvania University in Lexington, Kentucky.

**ROLL CALL**

Bob King, Lee Nimocks, and Tammie Clements from the Council staff attended.

Discuss President Evaluation Survey Responses The purpose of the meeting was to review the responses to the surveys pertaining to President King's annual evaluation. Governor Patton summarized the results.

- 59 surveys were sent out; 36 were completed.
- 13 members of the General Assembly were given the opportunity to respond; 3 responded.
- Governor Beshear and three of his staff were given the opportunity to respond; 1 response was received from the Governor's office staff.
- 8 university presidents, the KCTCS president, and the AIKCU president were given the opportunity to respond; 7 responded.
- 16 Council members were given the opportunity to respond; 15 responded.
- 10 CPE senior staff were given the opportunity to respond; 5 responded.

The Executive Committee was pleased overall with the responses. Governor Patton said the results will be helpful to Mr. King and the Council.

The committee was disappointed in the number of responses received from the Governor's office and the legislature. Will need to work on these groups next year.

Governor Patton mentioned building relationships with legislative leadership as a focus item. There are two issues—there is the Council and there is Mr. King's performance, and the Council has to do a better job of educating the General Assembly.

Governor Patton and the committee members said Mr. King performed well and recognized Mr. King for job well-done.

Mr. King thanked the committee members and said the surveys are helpful.

The committee recommended no salary increase for Mr. King at this time.

Governor Patton did say that the statute regarding the CPE president's salary needs to be revisited in light of recent developments of institutional president salary increases. Governor Patton will work with Mr. King regarding the statute.

The Executive Committee will report the survey responses to the Council at its meeting later in the day June 10.
