Recommended Communication and Advertising Plan

Print/Electronic

It is recommended that the advertisement representing the position is placed in national publications which are readily available and read by a broad audience of potential candidates. Among those are the following:

- Social media outlets typically used by the organization should be recipient of the information.
- The office should engage social media and print information upon placement of the advertisement for all typical outlets.
- Kentucky has 23 daily, 120 weekly and more newspapers (Kentucky Press Association).
 A selected number of them may merit attention with a press release issued by the Council office. This will accomplish the important task of informing statewide readers of the search.
- A single-point of contact for media inquiry and official response is necessary.

Office Web Site/Association of Governing Boards Search Web Site
