PREFACE

Preparing students for transfer to a four-year college or university is a core function of community colleges. The Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS), which is comprised of 16 colleges with over 70 campuses, plays a major role in promoting student mobility between the two-year and four-year sectors of postsecondary education in Kentucky. In 2014-15, 5,826 students transferred from two-year to four-year institutions in Kentucky, and on average during the preceding five years, over 6,000 students transferred each year.

This report provides information on the community and technical college students transferring to Kentucky's public or independent four-year institutions of higher education. It details data regarding where students transfer, what majors they pursue, and their retention and graduation rates at four-year institutions. The purpose of the report is to provide analysts, educators, staff, and decision makers at KCTCS with vital statistics on transfer students and credits, which will allow for informed discussion on the transfer process and mobility between Kentucky's postsecondary education sectors.

The report is a snapshot of Academic Year (AY) 2014-15, spanning three semesters: summer 2014, fall 2014, and spring 2015. It consists of four sections that highlight the following information for students transferring their KCTCS-earned credits to four-year institutions in Kentucky:

- Number of transfer students and transfer credit hours;
- Demographics of students who transfer;
- Receiving institutions and fields of study after transfer; and
- Student retention and graduation rates post-transfer.

The Kentucky Student Transfer Feedback Report is based entirely on data from the CPE Comprehensive Database System (KPEDS), and includes data from AY 2010-11 through AY 2014-15. With the inclusion of multiple years, this report is able to provide both retention rates as well as graduation rates for transfer students.

DEFINING TRANSFER STUDENTS

Only students who transferred from a KCTCS institution to a four-year public or AIKCU institution are included in this report. A cohort is defined as the annual number of first-time transfer students identified by the four-year public or independent institution's student record file (type 1), who entered a four-year public or independent postsecondary institution in Kentucky in that academic year.

While other forms of transfer, such as lateral transfer, are not uncommon, this report focuses on two-to-four-year transfer students, classified by four-year institutions as first-time transfers. These students are thought of as "typical" transfer students, often referred to as vertical or upward transfers. In 2014-15, 5,826 students in the state of Kentucky transferred from a KCTCS institution to a four-year institution.

Note: Institutional Closures

Mid-Continent University closed on June 30, 2014, and St. Catharine College closed in July 2016. Data regarding student mobility within the following report may be affected by these closures, as students at the time of closing as well as students in subsequent years identified alternative postsecondary options.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

Statewide Data across the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS)

Number of Transfer Students

- In 2014-15, 5,826 KCTCS students transferred to a four-year institution in Kentucky. Of those students, 4,907 transferred to a four-year public institution (84.2%).
- From 2010-11 to 2014-15, student transfers have risen slightly (5,612 in 2010-11), yet the greatest number of transfers occurred in 2011-12 (6,432 transfer students).
- More transfers in 2014-15 came from Bluegrass Community and Technical College than any other KCTCS college. Bluegrass transfers account for about 20% of all KCTCS transfers.
- From 2013-14 to 2014-15, most KCTCS institutions experienced a decline in the number of students who transferred. Exceptions include Southcentral Kentucky Community and Technical College, which saw a one-year increase of 21%, and Madisonville Community College, which saw a 12% increase from 2013-14 to 2014-15.

Credit Hours and Status upon Transfer

• About a third of students (1,960) transferred with 60 or more credit hours, but only 15% had earned an associate degree prior to transferring. The average credit hours upon transfer in 2014-2015 were 40 hours. This average has remained steady since 2010-11.

Demographic Information of Transfer Students

- Approximately 83% of transfer students list their race/ethnicity as White. Some (8%) list their race/ethnicity as African American, and 3% as Hispanic. The number of Hispanic transfer students increased 63% over five years (2010-11 2014-15), alongside a 115% increase in students cited as Nonresident Alien, and a 93% increase in students listed as Two or More Races.
- 63% of transfer students list their gender as female.
- 66% of students transferred to full-time status at their four-year institution.
- Approximately 56% of transfer students are of traditional age (24 years or younger), while 44% are 25 or older.

Where Students Transfer and What they Study

- Students primarily transfer to four-year public institutions (84%). Of those students, 16.4% transferred to Eastern Kentucky University in 2014-15, 14.3% to Western Kentucky, and 13.8% to the University of Louisville. Of the AIKCU Institutions, Lindsey Wilson College (2.5%), Campbellsville University (2.3%), Midway University (1.9%), and Spalding University (1.9%) received the most transfer students.
- The most popular major for students after transferring was Health Professions and Related Programs (15.8%), followed by Business, Management, Marketing, and Related Support Services (13.2%), Education (12.9%), and Public Administration and Social Service Professions (7.8%). In 2014-15, 423 (7.3%) of students transferred with an Undecided/Undeclared/Not Designated major. While these were the most popular majors overall, variation existed across KCTCS institutions. For example, Hazard Community and Technical College and Henderson Community College each had at least 10% of their transfer students declare a major within Liberal Arts and Sciences, General Studies, and Humanities.

Student Retention and Graduation Rates Post-Transfer

- The retention rate one year after transfer for students who transferred from KCTCS to four-year KY public institutions in 2013-14 was 83.5% (4,033 students), climbing to 84.5% (4,137 students) in 2014-15.
- The retention rate one year after transfer for students who transferred from KCTCS to four-year AIKCU institutions in 2013-14 was 71.7% (786 students), rising to 78.7% for 2014-15 (723 students).
- Graduation rates for the 2012-13 cohort of transfer students rose slightly as compared to rates for the 2011-12 cohort. The graduation rate three years after transfer for the 2012-13 cohort of KCTCS transfer students was 24.9%, as compared to 23.6% for the 2011-12 cohort. The graduation rate four years after transfer for the 2012-13 cohort was 41.4%, as compared to 40.5% for the 2011-12 cohort.







Student Transfers with and without an Associate Degree






2014-2015 Transfers by Gender

2014-15 Transfer by Age










Student Transfers with and without an Associate Degree






2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions




2014-15 Transfers by Age












2014-15 Transfers by Gender


2014-15 Transfers by Gender




2014-15 Transfers by Gender






2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions




2014-215 Transfers by Age






2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institution




2014-15 Transfers by Age






2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions




2014-15 Transfers by Age




2014-15 Transfers by Gender






2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions










2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions




2014-15 Transfers by Age






2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions




2014-15 Transfers by Age






2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions




2014-15 Transfers by Age




2014-15 Transfers by Gender






2014-15 Transfers by Gender










2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions




2014-15 Transfers by Age








2014-15 Transfers by Gender



2014-15 Transfers by Full-time or Part-time Status at Four-Year Institutions




2014-15 Transfers by Age




