The Untapped Market: Targeting Adult Learners to Meet Your Campus Goals In 2021, Kentucky was one of four states chosen by the State Higher Education Executive Officers (SHEEO) and Education Strategies Group (ESG) to participate in an Educational Attainment Academy to help states focus, plan, and develop implementation strategies to address educational attainment gaps among working-age adults. Kentucky's focus for the Academy was building a more comprehensive state strategy around improving educational outcomes for adult learners, with a strong focus on equity and the needs of low-income Kentuckians and people of color. Collaborating with a state team of around 20 representatives from state agencies, educational institutions, and state and community-level organizations, CPE has compiled a list of policy recommendations for further action.
