WELCOME & AGENDA

EPSO Workgroup Co-Leads Robin Hebert and Harmony Little welcomed the members of the workgroup. The meeting agenda and meeting objectives were reviewed and discussed with the aim to refine and prioritize action steps related to the workgroup's 2023 recommendations and to provide feedback on the Dual Credit Policy draft.

REFINE & PRIORITIZE RECOMMENDED ACTIONS FOR 2023

The workgroup members divided into breakout groups to identify and refine the recommended action steps for 2023 for the priority areas of improving advising related to Early Postsecondary Opportunities (EPSOs), effective communications, incentivizing teaching credentialing for (EPSOs), and ensuring (EPSO) program quality and alignment.

DUAL CREDIT POLICY FEEDBACK

Alex Perry, Coordinator of the College in High School Alliance (CHSA) provided a presentation to discuss Kentucky's Dual Credit Attainment Goal and the various strategies that would be used to accomplish those goals. Expanding access and success among students with little or no current access to dual credit; focusing on providing Kentucky students with meaningful dual credit experiences; supporting student success in dual credit; strengthening partnerships between high schools and colleges, and engaging employer partners; and expanding access to (EPSOs) were discussed as ways the strategies contribute to accomplishing Kentucky's Dual Credit Attainment Goal. The draft proposed Dual Credit Policy for Kentucky Public and Participating Postsecondary Institutions and Secondary Schools was reviewed and members provided feedback and suggested edits and additions to the draft policy.

CLOSING

Harmony Little reminded the workgroup members that there would be no meeting in December, but to expect for meetings to resume in January, 2023. Members were reminded of the Student Success Summit that will occur February 27-28, 2023.
