


#### Success of Underprepared Students in Gateway Courses







#### TOTAL KCTCS CREDENTIALS AWARDED




#### POSTSECONDARY PUBLIC HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT

Undergraduates, Fall 2019




#### 2019-2020 EXPENSES

#### PROGRAMS AND CREDENTIALS

#### **ASSOCIATE DEGREE**

The associate degree includes transfer degrees and technical/professional degrees, many of which can also transfer to four-year programs. The Associate in Arts/Associate in Science/Associate in Fine Arts degrees are designed for students to complete the first two years of coursework necessary for a four year degree. The A.A., A.S., A.F.A degrees are focused on transfer. The Associate in Applied Science degree is designed for students to enter the workforce upon completion. To earn an associate degree, students must successfully complete 60 to 68 credit hours\*, depending on the program.

(\*programs with an exception may require greater than 68 credits).

#### **DIPLOMA**

The diploma is designed to prepare students for employment in a specific technical field. To earn a diploma, students must successfully complete 36 to 60 credit hours.

#### CERTIFICATE

The certificate is offered in technical programs and can be earned in as little as one semester, depending on the program.





#### **POINTS OF PRIDE**

KCTCS is the largest provider of postsecondary education, online and dual credit classes and workforce training in Kentucky. We offer programs that are necessary to meet the workforce demands of today and into the future.

Our colleges collaborate with businesses around the state and align their programs with business needs, so our students have the skills needed for jobs in their communities. As those needs change, so does our curriculum.

Students' coursework transfers to all Kentucky universities and many outside the state.

We have the lowest tuition of any higher education institution in Kentucky. Students pay less than half what they'd pay at our four-year partners.

Since 1999, our enrollment has increased 111 percent.

Since our creation, the number of credentials we've awarded has increased nearly 300%. In fact, we are 8th in the nation in credentials awarded by public, two-year colleges; 2nd based on state population.

For people who want to earn a certificate and go directly work, we offer many short-term programs. Some can be completed in four months or less and can lead to jobs that pay up to \$60,000.

More than three million participants have received workforce training through our Workforce Solutions division since it was created.

Because of grants and scholarships, some KCTCS students have no out-of-pocket expense. Only 18% of KCTCS students take out student loans. Those who do, borrow less than \$5,000.

Since our creation, KCTCS has served 1 million Kentuckians.
