State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA)

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Introduction

Kentucky became a member of the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA) in October 2016. <http://nc-sara.org/>

SARA is overseen by a national council. The National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA) was established to help expand students' access to educational opportunities and ensure more efficient, consistent, and effective regulation of distance learning programs.

SARA is administered by the four regional higher education compacts, Midwestern Higher Education Compact (MHEC), the New England Board of Higher Education (NEBHE), the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) and the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE).

Kentucky is a SREB compact state, and CPE is a member of the S-SARA Regional Steering Committee. <https://www.sreb.org/state-authorization-sara>

As the NC-SARA State Portal Entity Contact for Kentucky, CPE reviews applications from Kentucky institutions wanting to become SARA-approved by the state so that those institutions may offer distance education to residents of other states.

Institutions are eligible to apply for participation in SARA if they:

- Are located in a SARA member state;
- Are a degree-granting Institution, appropriately authorized (by Congress, a U.S. state, territory or district, or a federally recognized Indian tribe) to award associate degrees or higher;
- Are institutionally accredited by an accrediting body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and whose scope of recognition, as specified by the U.S. Department of Education, includes distance education;
- As a non-public institution, meet the institutional financial responsibility requirements for SARA participation.

Detailed information about institutional eligibility is found in the SARA Policy Manual, Section 3.1.

CPE also serves as the agent for complaints filed relative to KY SARA approved institutions, and facilitates the resolution of complaints filed by Kentucky residents relative to out-of-state institutions.

SARA does not cover professional licensing board approval for programs leading to state licensing in fields such as nursing, teacher education, psychology, etc.

SARA, in alignment with federal regulations, does, require that proper notification be given to students as to whether courses and programs will meet the professional licensure requirements in states where students are located.
