### **Administration and Other Responsibilities**


- Convening of campus groups



A <u>coherent</u> educational experience is well organized and scaffolded with a clear connection between general education and majors.

<u>Engaging</u> learning opportunities intentionally address student interest, facilitate active involvement, and motivate students to pursue their academic and professional goals.

<u>Transformational</u> refers to positive change in knowledge, skills and perspectives.
