Introduction

The Kentucky Postsecondary Education Improvement Act of 1997, otherwise known as House Bill 1, articulated six goals, one of which was the proposed creation of at least one nationally recognized program of distinction or one nationally recognized applied research program. Those became what are now known as the Programs of Distinction (PODs).

The programs of distinction were funded in the 1998-biennium through the regional University Excellence Trust Fund with the purpose of helping regional universities accomplish the goal of a nationally recognized academic program of distinction or an applied research program.

In order to better understand and appreciate the work of the PODs, the CPE has created this annual reporting template. Program reports are due annually on July 31st.
