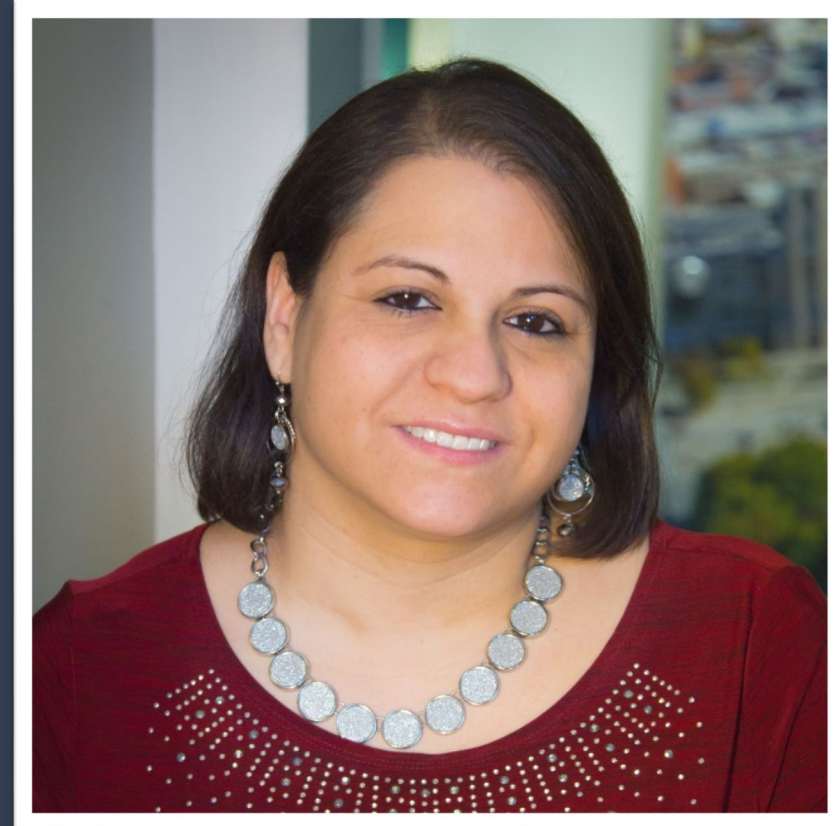

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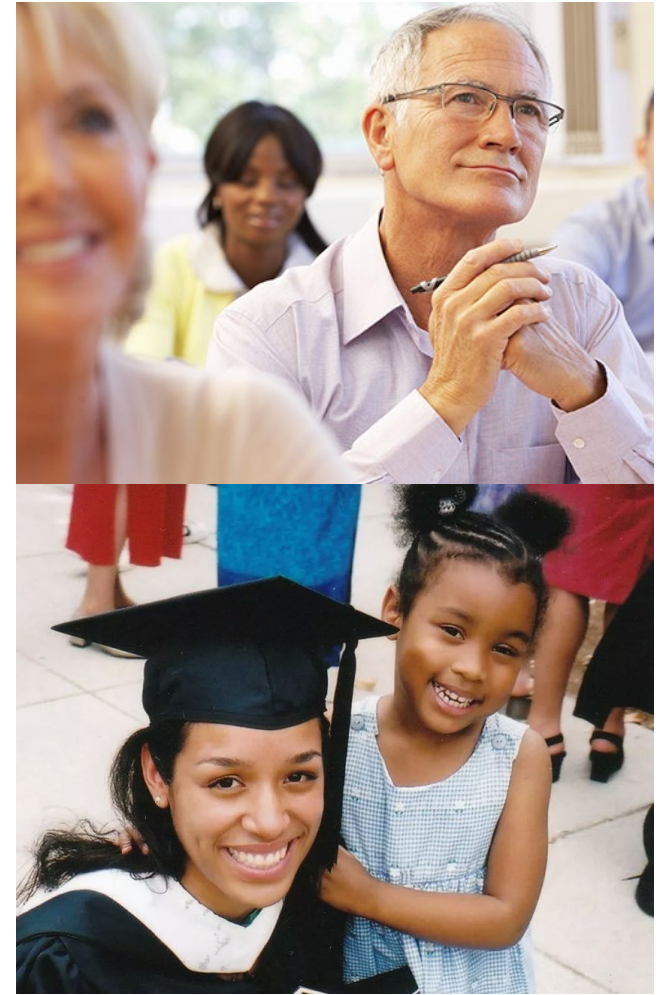

Who Are Adult Learners

- Adult Learners are a diverse population of students who vary in age (usually 24+) and life experiences.
- Common Names of Adult Learners:
 - Adult Learners
 - Non-Traditional Students
 - Adult Students
 - Returning Adults
 - Adult Returners
 - Mature Learners



Data from EAB

- 1 in 2 adult learners consider online options when researching programs
- 49.6% of 1,000 adult learners said they would change their plans and consider going back to school if tuition was more affordable

- 61% of adult learners say career or financial factors are their primary reason for enrolling
- Family and work-related commitments are the top enrollment barrier for adult learners

Challenges Adult Learners Face

- Feeling disconnected from classmates and their institution
- Balancing work, family, school, etc.
- Lacking self-confidence
- Not prepared for academics
- Unable to utilize or understand technology
- Cost of tuition / low-income



Challenges Adult Learners Face (continued)

- Lack of flexibility with their schedule
- Credits won't transfer
- Unable to navigate or access campus resources
- Lack of childcare
- Undiagnosed learning disabilities
- Lack of support at home and/or work
- Moving often due to active military duty

Supporting and Advising Adult Learners

Advising Models

- *Holistic Advising/Coaching*, a developmental process that focuses on the “whole” student.
 - *Developmental Advising*
 - *Intrusive/Proactive Advising*
 - *Strengths-Based Advising*
 - *Appreciative Advising*



Supporting and Advising Adult Learners

Academic Advising / Support Network

- Email each of your newly accepted advisee
- Enroll adult learners into their courses each semester
- Offer evening Advising hours at-least one night a week
- Survey your Adult Learners once a semester and ask them what they need and want to be successful



Supporting and Advising Adult Learners

Academic Advising / Support Network

- Referrals to have learning disabilities diagnosed with accommodations made as needed via Accessibility Services
- Hire an Adult Learner as a Peer Mentor to support fellow Adult Learners
- Use a flexible advising model such as Holistic or Developmental
- Listen and help them develop realistic goals to build up their confidence as a non-traditional/Adult Learner



Supporting and Advising Adult Learners

Academic Advising / Support Network

- Encourage Adult Learners to develop a support network at home and on campus
- Family, friends, faculty, classmates, staff, etc.
- Advisors who support Adult Learners should have open drop-in hours during the day and at least one evening each week
- Consider having an open door policy, pending your student caseload size
- Advocate for dedicated individuals who specialize in supporting Adult Learners in campus support offices



Supporting and Advising Adult Learners

Flexibility for Adult Learners

- Offer credit for prior learning options
- Accept up to 80 transferable credits
- Support “I” incomplete grades for active military students
- Advocate for evening, weekend, hybrid, online, and summer class options
- Partner with a local daycare to offer child care
- Exempt them from select general education requirements (Ex: language)

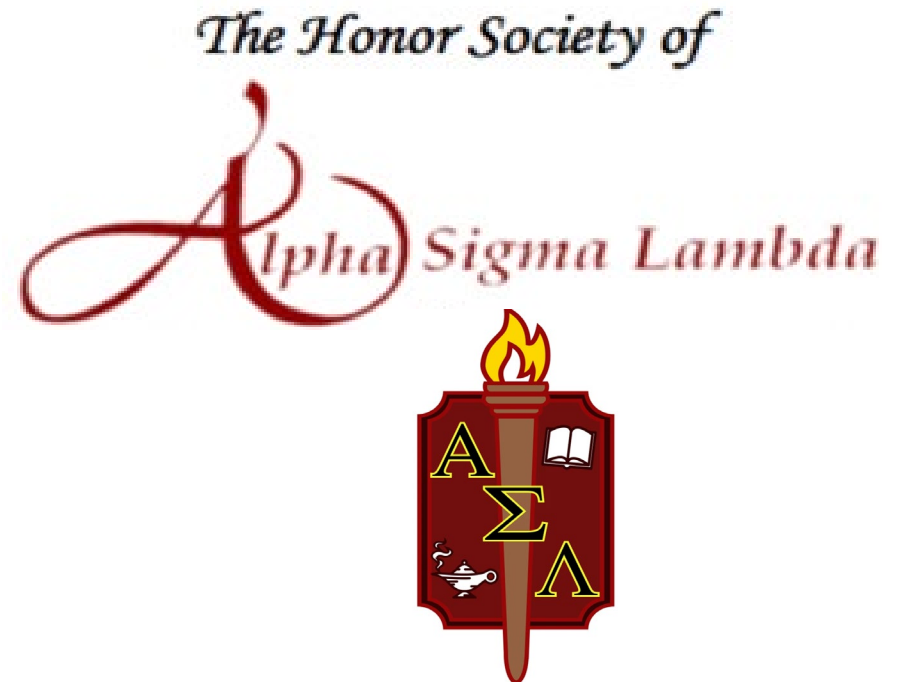
- Texting/Emailing

- Virtual Meetings/Classrooms
 - Blackboard Collaborate, Moodle, Blue Jeans, Skype, Go To Meeting, Zoom & Open Voice
- Social Media & Social Media Management Tools
 - Hootsuite, Buffer, Sprout Social, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn, & HubSpot



Supporting and Advising Adult Learners

Engagement and Community Building

- Adult Learner focused orientation with an online orientation option to provide flexibility
- Create an Adult Learner/Commuter Lounge
- Plan passive events or pre-recorded workshops
- Host Adult Learner appreciation week
- Offer a FAFSA and tax assistant workshop
- Monthly e-newsletter just for Adult Learners
- Establish an Alpha Sigma Lambda chapter



Supporting and Advising Adult Learners

Engagement and Community Building

- Veteran or Active Military Students
 - Establish a Student Veterans of America chapter or partner with them to sponsor events
- Online Adult Learners
 - Have an online holiday party for your advisees as a way to allow people to get connected in a fun way. Play holiday music, have an ugly holiday sweater contest, and ask them to share their favorite holiday memory.
- Adult Learners who are Parents
 - Plan family friendly evening & weekend events
