



Some of the key Toyota philosophies that I have learned would be Toyota Production System(TPS), kaizen mindset, Respect for People, lean manufacturing, denwacho planning, and genchi genbutsu(go and see). I was challenged in many ways while at Toyota, and this will allow me to embrace challenges on my future endeavors."

"During my time at Toyota, I had to use AutoDesk Inventor to create functional and tolerance-specific parts to aid the Production team to run smoothly. I also had to use various softwares to respond to PLC breakdowns, Estic Gun faults, and implementing kaizens on various pieces of equipment. I learned the 8-step Toyota problem solving TBP method, and presented this work to the President and other executives of TMMWV."


