Check Your Eligibility



Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES)

The KEES program provides scholarships to Kentucky students who earn at least a 2.5 GPA each year they attend a certified Kentucky high school. The better they do in high school, the more they earn toward college. High school graduates participating in an eligible program may choose to request reimbursement of approved expenses from their KEES earnings instead of having funds sent directly to an eligible Kentucky college or university.




