A coin flip can change a kid's life

No one's chances for economic mobility should come down to a coin flip.

Yet, we estimate that there are at least 7,000 "coin flip" high schools where if you are Black, Hispanic, or from a low-income family, your chance of proceeding into higher education directly after high school is less than 50 percent.

When compared to White students, the year-to-year decline in undergraduate enrollment last fall was:

- 2X as high for Black students
- 3x as high for Indigenous students
- 5x as high for Hispanic students

Students are facing a myriad of challenges

- Inconsistent quality of virtual instruction
- Lack of access to broadband
- Social isolation from peers
- Health issues (both physical and mental)
- Caring for siblings and other family members
- Balancing school with work (particularly if family members have lost jobs)
- Uncertainty about what college will look like
- Concerns about moving away from home
- Concerns about affording a postsecondary education (and whether it's worth the cost)

Requirements and opportunities in the American Rescue Plan

- At the **district level**:
 - **\$22 billion** to address learning loss
- At the **state level**:
 - **\$6 billion** to address learning loss
 - **\$1 billion** for summer enrichment
- For higher education institutions:
 \$20 billion for financial aid





The Building Blocks of Support







Harnessing Data to Target Supports



Conduct an equity audit of Fall 2020 National Student Clearinghouse data to better understand gaps in direct enrollment by ethnicity, income, geography, etc.



Review current high school Seniors and Juniors completion of postsecondary preparation milestones (e.g. FAFSA completion, college applications) and academic gaps.



Leverage "coin flip high schools" analysis to identify schools that are either beating the odds or failing students of color.



Prioritize the most predictive measures of postsecondary success in data collection, reporting, and accountability.



Postsecondary Transition Momentum Metrics

Collectively, the Momentum Metrics represent the most predictive indicators of postsecondary preparation, enrollment, and retention.





Summer Bridge Programs



Students enroll in courses in Math and/or ELA to place directly into credit-bearing coursework upon enrolling in postsecondary without the need for remediation.



Advisors provide additional social-emotional and navigational supports to help students navigate the transition to postsecondary.



Can offer financial incentives to students, instructors, and/or advisors for meeting college-ready benchmarks and successfully enrolling in postsecondary.

Tutoring Corps



Recruit and train a cadre of tutors to provide academic support in Math and/or ELA to students to address learning loss.



Staffing models may be based on near-peers, teachers and paraprofessionals, or other community volunteers.



In addition to stimulus funding, can also leverage existing GEAR UP, TRIO, and Americorps tutoring programs.





Building capacity through Americorps

- The American Rescue Plan (ARP) dedicates \$1 billion to expand Americorps programs.
- Serve Kentucky has several Americorps programs across the state that provide tutoring, mentorship, and advising supports to students, including:
 - ATEAM
 - Kentucky College Coaches
 - Morehead State University Corps
 - Partners for Education
 - Teach Kentucky







Dual Credit



Offer free dual credit courses to high school seniors in gateway courses to build early momentum for students' postsecondary credit accrual.



Provide additional equity grants to low-income students to cover the costs of fees, books, food, and transportation.



Link with state or institutional summer bridge programs to provide additional navigational supports. NOVA

Advising



Build a statewide postsecondary advising corps of either recent graduates or counseling professionals.



Establish college and career academies to provide professional development and certifications for high school counselors around postsecondary access and success.



Launch a statewide FAFSA completion campaign to target outreach and support to students and families.







FAFSA completion is a critical component to meeting statewide attainment goals

Enrollment

90 percent of students who complete the FAFSA enroll directly in college after high school, compared to just 55 percent of noncompleters.



Persistence

For every \$1,000 in financial aid a student receives, the rate at which they persist in their coursework increases, on average, by four percentage points.





FAFSA completion is particularly important for low-income students

Emergency Grants



Provide emergency financial assistance for incoming and current undergraduate students.



Prioritize aid for low-income students, students of color, and other student populations who have faced additional barriers due to the pandemic.



Leverage assistance as an opportunity to re-engage adult learners and encourage students with high credit hours to re-enroll.

Together As Buckeyes

The Together As Buckeyes emergency grants program is funded primarily by the CARES Act and available to all students — undergraduate, graduate and professional — through the Student Financial Aid office.







Prioritizing adult learners



Resources for institutional and state higher education leaders to develop a *Rapid Response Action Plan* to serve the needs of displaced workers as learners, including focusing on:

- Making higher education **financially possible**
- Redesigning programs of study to meet students where they are
- Promoting reskilling through outreach
- **Onboarding** for purpose and acceleration
- Supporting students holistically



Key Questions to Ask

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Owning the Handoff

- How can we create incentives (financial, accountability, etc.) for cross-sector alignment to support students' transitions?
- How are we prioritizing a robust set of high-quality pathways to a postsecondary credential with labor market value?

Smoothing Transitions

• What is our strategy for using federal stimulus \$ to provide postsecondary advising and transition support, alongside academic recovery?



Expanding Capacity

• How are we ensuring the federal stimulus \$ supports students and communities most impacted by the pandemic?
