The Profile is a set of career-focused learning outcomes each graduate should possess upon completion. These skills can be mastered through the academic curriculum and co-curricular experiences.

This project explored how governing boards and institutional leadership could work together more effectively to improve student retention, graduation, and post completion outcomes – especially for students from low-income, rural, and historically marginalized race/ethnicity backgrounds. Join this session to learn about progress made in the Ascendium-supported work, and exciting next steps that will occur over the years ahead with support from Lumina Foundation.
